Concrete wastewater handler expands westward

An affiliate of an Elk Grove company whose bins control wash water from concrete trucks -- a potential source of runoff pollution and fines -- has begun distributing and serving the systems in the northeast Bay Area.

Concrete Washout Systems Inc. said Monday its partner American Concrete Washouts Inc. has added Solano, Napa and Sonoma counties to its territory. The affiliate been serving construction sites in Placer, Yuba and Sutter counties since May.

American Concrete has deployed and serviced almost 100 bins in its initial market so far, Concrete Washout said Monday, exceeding initial expectations. In April Concrete Washout's president and co-owner, Mark Jenkins, said the company had seen "phenomenal growth" in its first year.

Concrete Washout's portable, watertight bins let tradespeople wash out concrete material and wastewater at a job site while preventing runoff into local storm drains. CWS says it has a patent pending on its bin.
